

AFFIDAVIT OF DENNIS LEAHY

Suffolk, ss.

**Boston, Massachusetts
September 11, 2000**

I, Dennis Leahy, being duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:

1. I am currently employed by the Insurance Fraud Bureau of Massachusetts as an investigator and have been so employed since February 2000. Prior to that, for approximately 23 years, I was a Special Agent employed by the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms ("ATF"). I was one of the ATF Special Agents assigned to investigate the explosion of the device that occurred on October 28, 1991, killing Boston Police Bomb Squad Officer Jeremiah Hurley and seriously injuring his partner, Boston Police Bomb Squad Officer Francis Foley.


2. As part of the investigation, myself and fellow law enforcement officers analyzed various components and fragments recovered from the explosive device and attempted to identify the manufacturer and point of sale of those items. Among other items, I learned that a Radio Shack toggle switch with a particular model number was contained in the explosive device. In response to a request from ATF, the Tandy Corporation, the parent corporation for Radio Shack, faxed to ATF, on November 12, 1991, a printout listing the date of sale, store identification number, customer name, address, city, state, zip code, telephone number quantity purchased and sales ticket number for all

Radio Shack toggle switches of the type contained in the explosive device, that were sold in Massachusetts during the period January 1, 1990 through November 1991. A copy of that printout and the accompanying fax is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

3. Page 38 of that printout, attached hereto as Exhibit 2, contained information that a Radio Shack toggle switch of the type under investigation had been sold on October 18, 1991, ten days before the explosion, at store 01-1021, which was the Radio Shack store located at 197 Massachusetts Avenue, Boston, across from the Christian Science Center. The printout contained what appeared to be the customer's name, spelled as Sahy, which I believe to have been a transposition for Shay, under the listing for the address of the customer, and the number 5100 where the name should have been. The sales ticket number was identified as 98973.

4. I subsequently noticed that this Radio Shack store was located across from where one of the suspects of the investigation, Alfred Trenkler, had installed microwave equipment on the roof. I first visited this Radio Shack location on December 11, 1991 and reviewed numerous sales slips located there. Among those slips, I found sales slip number 098973.
