SUBJECT: Authorization for Interception Order Application

This is with regard to your recommendation that I, an appropriately designated official of the Criminal Division, authorize an application to a federal judge of competent jurisdiction for an order under Title 18, United States Code, Section 2518, authorizing the interception of wire communications for a thirty (30) day period from the voice mail feature of a digital display pager bearing the telephone number (617) 553-0778, leased from Metro Media Paging, Inc., and subscribed to by ARCOMM, Inc., 82 Broad St., Weymouth, Massachusetts, in connection with an investigation into possible violations of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 844(i) and 371, by Alfred W. Trenkler, John Cates, Richard Brown, Thomas A. Shay, and others as yet unknown.

By virtue of the authority vested in him by Section 2516 of Title 18, United States Code, the Attorney General of the United States has by Order Number 1348-89, dated May 24, 1989, designated specific officials in the Criminal Division to authorize applications for court orders authorizing the interception of wire or oral communications. As a duly designated official in the Criminal Division, this power is exercisable by me. WHEREFORE, acting under this delegated power, I hereby authorize the above-described application to be made by any investigative or law enforcement officer of the United States as defined in Section 2510(7) of Title 18, United States Code.


