[7] SHAY: Today is October 17, 1992. It is almost one [8] year after the death of Jeremiah Hurley and [9] the maiming of his partner Francis X. Foley, [10] a year after a bomb exploded and left one [11] officer dead and one destroyed for life, two [12] families destroyed without ever having any [13] chance of repair until the builder of that [14] device and conspirators are behind bars for [15] life.

[16] I, Tommy Shay, am guilty of something in that [17] case, but do not know what. I don't have the [18] average 20 year old male history. From age 5 [19] to 18, I was in the Department of Social [20] Services care. [21] I have no history of violence, not one record [22] of assault or otherwise from age 5 until now. [23] I am the one that had violence used against [24] him, and there is evidence that thirteen [25] years of my life, I was robbed of ever being [26] able to love someone or care.

[1] I was sexually abused by counselors, by [2] doctors and by my therapists. It was [3] mistreated physically, mentally and [4] emotionally.

[5] Today, my feelings toward life are dim. [6] There is no love. There is no caring. I [7] have lost my friends and family and, [8] especially, my self-esteem, trust, love, [9] care, pride to be an American or actually to [10] be alive.

[11] There are no smiles. There is no happiness. [12] Just a big emptiness. If ever I'm guilty of [13] any wrongdoing, it would be done or had been [14] done mentally by using words.

[8] MARINELLA: Okay. So what happens in this relationship [9] that makes him care about - I mean, if it's [10] a casual acquaintance, I don't understand why [11] he would -

[12] SHAY: We have the same feelings. We have - he was [13] abused and I was abused, and we relate.

[14] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm.

[15] SHAY: That's a relief. He couldn't do anything [16] about it and neither could I. We cried [17] together. We talked. He was - he - as an [18] acquaintance, he was there if ever I needed [19] him.

[20] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm.

[21] SHAY: Not like my friends, but he was an [22] acquaintance. It wasn't like - you know, I [23] wouldn't call him every year, but, say, after [24] work. I have friends that I call every day [25] of the week.

[26] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm. Okay. So you called a lot about the

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[1] abuse issue in the course of your [2] relationship. At what - at what point - I [8] - was he angry about your

situation? [4] About what had happened to you?

[5] SHAY: He was angry that it - that it had happened [6] to me and maybe that was my father's fault or [7] my mother's fault because it was in three [8] months.

[9] MARINELLA: Okay. So he builds a bomb.

[10] SHAY: So he builds a bomb, tries to kill my father [11] and thinks that I'm going to be happy over [12] it, maybe even thinks that I'm going to [13] collect a half million dollars because my [14] father's in a lawsuit with some people.

[15] MARINELLA: Okay. Now, let's get into some of that a [16] little bit. You - you - you said that you [17] are guilty of something in this case.

[18] SHAY: I'm guilty of knowing who built the bomb [19] after the fact. I did not know anything [20] about the bomb or explosives in this case at [21] any time before October 30th at ten a.m.

[22] MARINELLA: Okay.

[23] SHAY: Not one piece of information. I had maybe [24] hints or thoughts or just discoveries in my [25] head, but never to put them together and make [26] something of killing anybody or harming

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[1] anybody.

[2] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm. But you helped purchase the [8] equipment for this bomb. You're admitting [4] that.

[5] SHAY: I'm admitting that, but not to the fact that [6] I was helped to purchase stuff to build the [7] bomb. I was helping to purchase stuff for [8] his wardrobe, hair cream or lights or [9] whatever.

[10] MARINELLA: Now, you said that he had you purchase these [11] things.

[12] SHAY: That's right.

[13] MARINELLA: Why did you purchase them? Why did he tell [14] you to purchase them?

[15] SHAY: Because I like to handle money and he's got, [16] you know, mega hundred dollar bills, and I'm [17] always, you know, like the Radio Shack clerk [18] on Mass Ave. recognized me.

[19] I don't know really why he recognized me, but [20] Al had me go in there and purchase these [21] things. He said, go across the street. He [22] gave me a list. I went in there. I got the [23] stuff. Al came in behind me and he

know [24] that I liked to purchase, you know, I like to [25] be the guy with the money and, you know, go [26] out to a restaurant, whatever, and buy the

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[1] stuff.

[2] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm.

[3] SHAY: So he had me doing all the purchasing.

[4] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm.

[5] SHAY: But not until October 29th, the day after, [6] did I piece everything together and say, [7] gee, I'm the one that bought the stuff, I'm [8] going to - I'm doing - going to be the one [9] to pay because I bought something.

We're talking about millions [10] of dollars here - mean, if they're willing [11] to spend millions of dollars and believe me, [12] then that's a good reason for you to believe [13] me.  
 [14] MARINELLA: Or maybe they're working with you now. [15] mean for the first time, you're finally [16] saying some things and.  
 [17] SHAY: And they add up -  
 [18] MARINELLA: they're starting to be able to put this [19] this case together finally. Is this a case [20] where maybe somebody was trying to track you [21] dad, you did know about it - ahead of time -  
 [22] SHAY: Nope -  
 [23] MARINELLA: and it got out of control?  
 [24] SHAY: Nope.  
 [25] MARINELLA: No maybe, huh?  
 [26] SHAY: No maybe.

 [15] MARINELLA: But did you know that ahead of time?  
 [16] SHAY: I did know that. This Allen Pransky, my [17] father's lawyer, told me.  
 [18] MARINELLA: You looked into it.  
 [19] SHAY: Hum?  
 [20] MARINELLA: You looked into it -  
 [21] SHAY: No -  
 [22] MARINELLA: -ahead of time?

[23] SHAY: This is in 1990 -  
 [24] MARINELLA: Mm-hmm -  
 [25] SHAY: -I knew about that.  
 [26] MARINELLA: Again, I'm just asking because so many things

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[1] that you and I have talked about in the past [2] few months, A, haven't happened or, B, the [3] truth -
