AFFIDAVIT

I, Paul V. Kelly, Assistant U.S. Attorney, being duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:


1. The Boston Globe published an article on December 1, 1992, quoting Thomas Shay Jr., as saying that he expected to be "indicted for the bombing during the week of December 14." (Exhibit "C").

2. Sometime thereafter, I spoke by telephone with Attorney Terry Segal who called to inquire about whether and when his client, Alfred Trenkler, might be indicted by the grand jury. I informed Attorney Segal that the matter was still being considered at various levels and that an indictment, if any, was still likely several weeks, and possibly several months away.

3. A few days after my telephone conversation with Attorney Segal, an associate of Trenkler's, James Harding, called Boston Police Detective Brendan Craven and reported that Trenkler had stated to Harding that he was not concerned about being indicted during the week of December 14th, since his Attorney had recently informed him that if there was ever to be an indictment, it was still several weeks or even months away.

4. According to the arresting officers, including Special Agent Jeff Kerr and Detective Craven, Trenkler appeared completely stunned and surprised when he was apprehended pursuant to the federal arrest warrant on December 16, 1992.
